

Double Funeral Wednesday For Mr. and Mrs. McLaughlin

ORISKANY FALLS — A double funeral for Harold J. (Red) McLaughlin, 79, and his wife, Helen L., 81, of 174 Main St. will be at 9:15 Wednesday from the Heintz Funeral Home, Clinton, and at 10 from St. Joseph's Church, Oriskany Falls.

Mrs. McLaughlin died Saturday night in the Harding Nursing Home, Waterville, about two hours before her husband died in his home.

Mr. McLaughlin had not been told about his wife's death. Dr. Charles Brady, coroner, attributed Mr. McLaughlin's death to natural causes.

Mr. McLaughlin was born at Oriskany Falls and attended local schools. He owned and operated the H.J. McLaughlin Luncheonette.

He was employed during World War II at Savage Arms

and after the war he worked for a brief time at Bendix Corp. He served with the Army during World War I.

He married Helen Harrington in 1923.

Mrs. McLaughlin was born in Brooklyn, daughter of Miles and Ellen Pembroke Harrington. She attended schools in Brooklyn and came to Oriskany Falls as a young woman.

Mr. and Mrs. McLaughlin were members of St. Joseph's Church.

They leave a daughter, Miss Barbara Ann McLaughlin, Arlington, Va. and a son, Richard H., Utica.

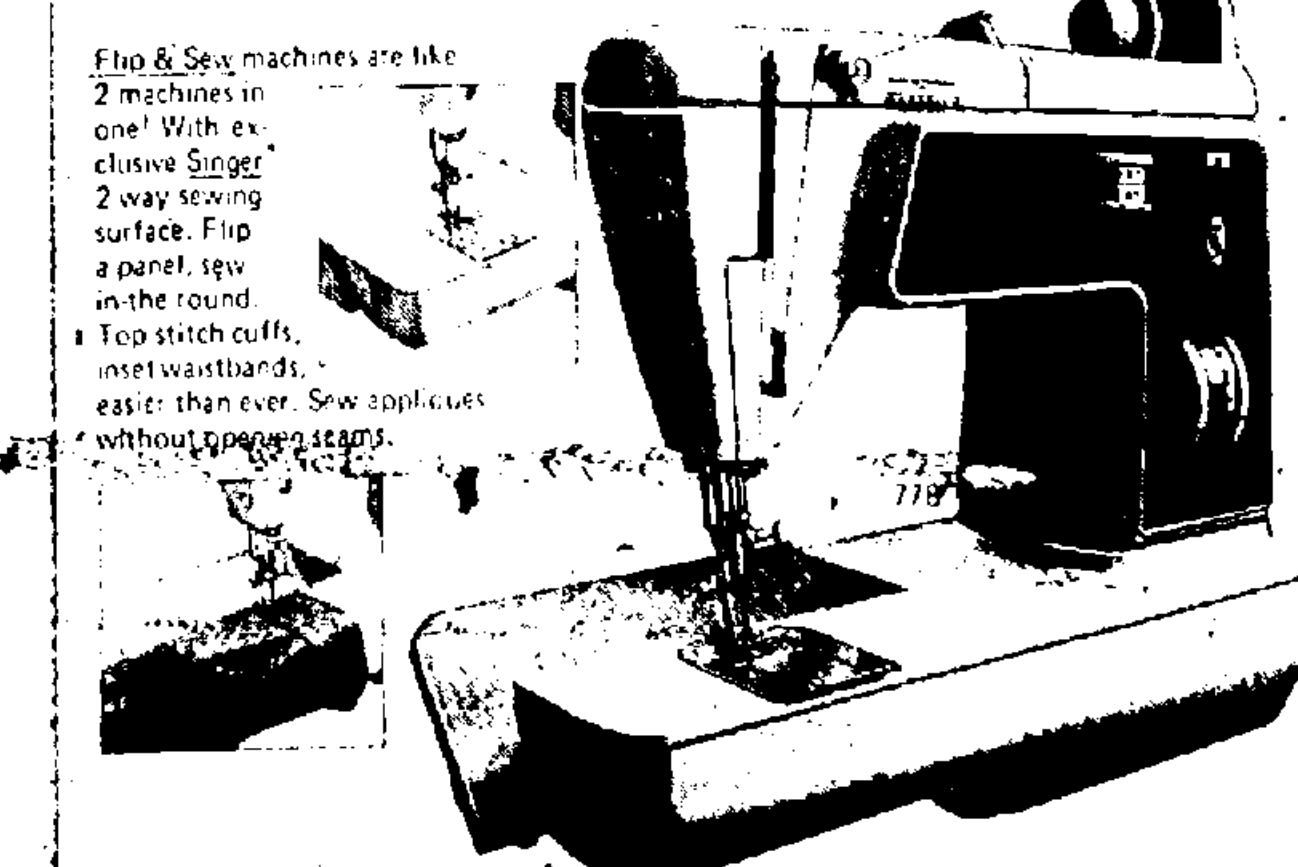

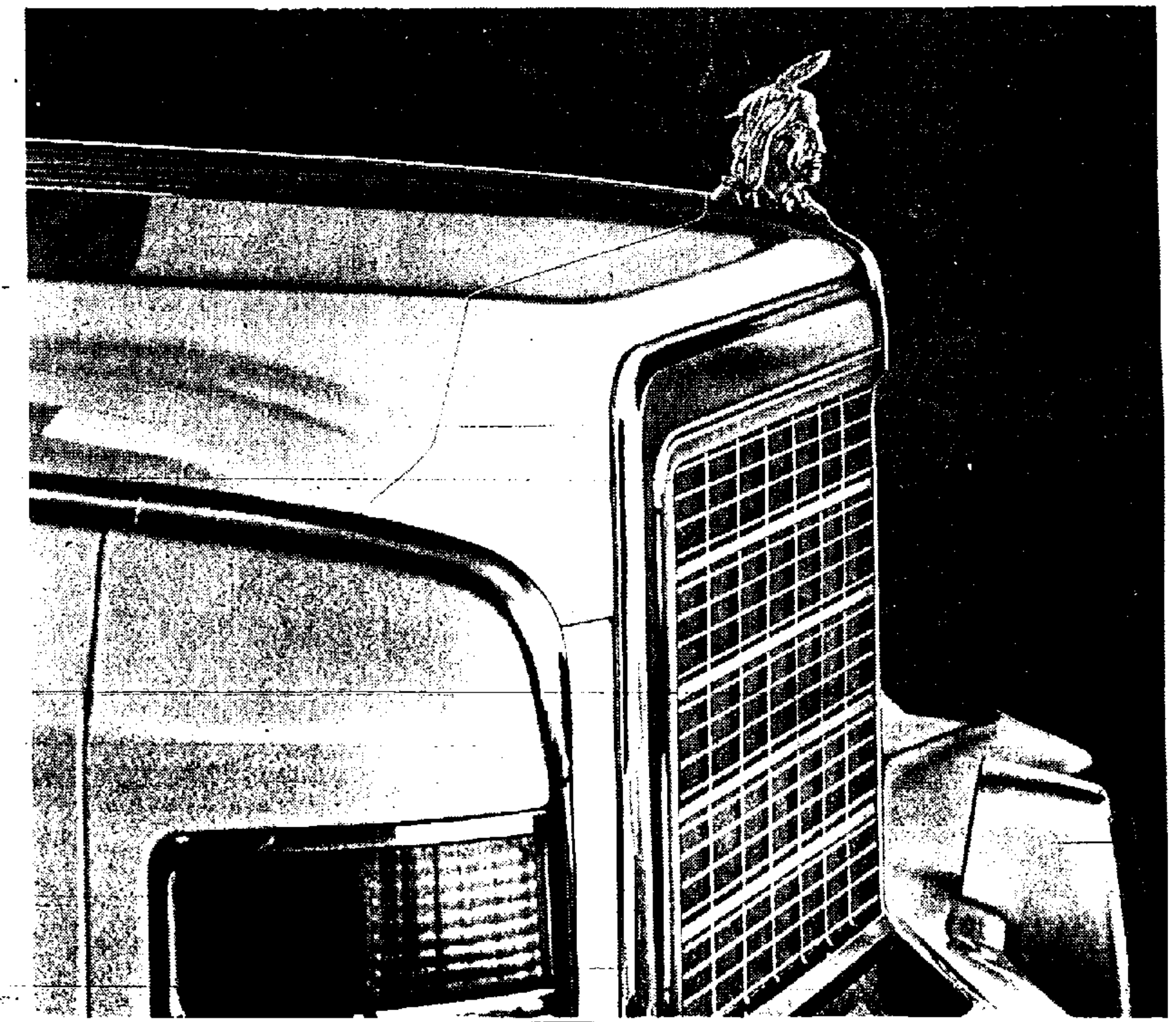
